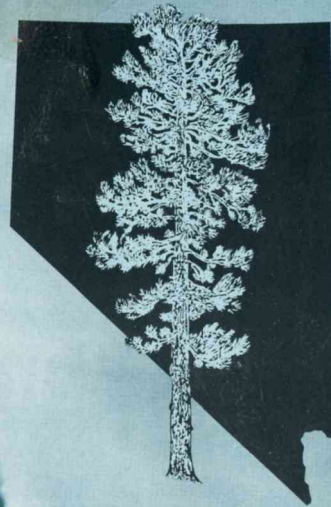
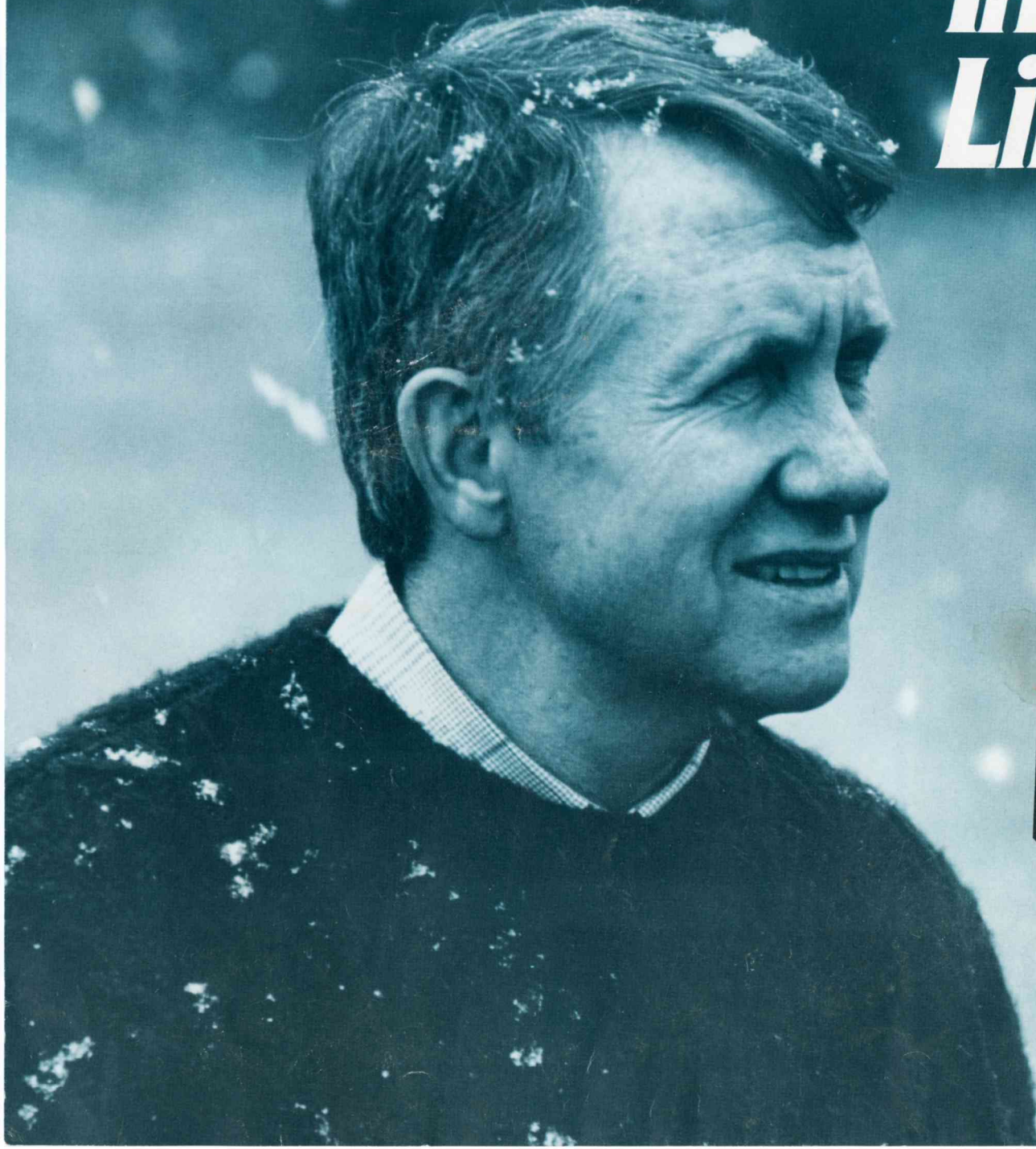

Harry Reid overcame a well-financed lobbying campaign by powerful out-of-state interests to create Nevada's first national park and to set aside its first significant wilderness areas for future generations.

His record proves he's been just that.



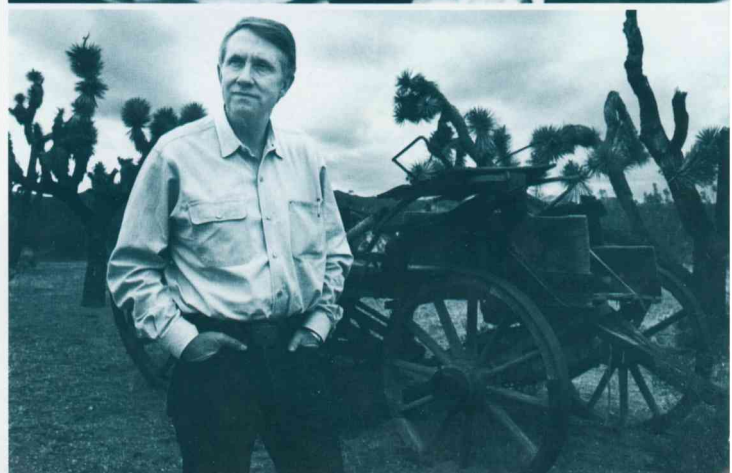

Taxpayers' Bill of Rights

Major Provisions:

1. Taxpayers are innocent until proven guilty.
2. Taxpayers are entitled to be told their rights when dealing with the IRS.
3. IRS agents should not be promoted on the basis of the amount they collect.
4. An inspector general should be established in the Treasury Department.
5. Taxpayers are not to be penalized for seeking advice. Taxpayers are entitled to a representative to accompany them in interviews.
