Lynn Greenhouse, second-year student at the University of Nevada School of Medicine, has been appointed student representative to the Committee on Aging of the American Academy of Family Physicians. Only one student is chosen nationally to serve for a year on this 12 - 15-member committee.

Greenhouse became interested in the field of geriatrics when she worked last summer in a Reno nursing home. That experience convinced her that many issues of aging are not being explored. She also is working to establish an Adopt-A-Grandparent program which will encourage medical students to visit hospitals and nursing homes and talk with the elderly.

Greenhouse is a graduate of Grand Junction High School in Grand Junction, CO; earned her bachelor's degree from Miami University, Oxford Campus, in Oxford, OH; and received a master's degree in international studies from the Johns Hopkins School for Advanced International Studies in Washington, DC.

Greenhouse is the daughter of Dr. Arnold and Louise Greenhouse, who both work at the medical school.
