

"Cancer Fraud and Quackery" Expert to Speak at Med School

A nationally recognized expert in cancer fraud and quackery will lecture medical students and dietitians at the University of Nevada School of Medicine in Reno on Thursday, April 18, and Friday, April 19 in Las Vegas.

William T. Jarvis, Ph.D., is co-founder and president of the National Council Against Health Fraud, Inc., is a member of the National Committee on Unproven Methods of Cancer Management of the American Cancer Society and the California Attorney General's Task Force on Health Fraud.

Dr. Jarvis has produced more than 80 publications dealing with consumer health issues, and has made more than 200 presentations before professional gatherings at the state, regional, national and international levels on topics such as food faddism, chiropractic, holistic health and cancer quackery.

His visit is co-sponsored by the Dairy Council of Utah and Nevada as part of their Visiting Professorship in Nutrition Program, and the School of Medicine's Nutrition Education and Research Program.
