Battle Mountain resident Matthew Stein is among the 47 members of the Class of 1992 at the University of Nevada School of Medicine. On Friday, May 15, Dr. Stein received his academic hood, the symbol of his acceptance into the profession of medicine, from Dr. Sandra Daugherty, the Department Family and Community Medicine.

Dr. Stein, who is the son of Paul and Bonde Scovil of Stockton, CA, attended Battle Mountain High School. He earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Nevada, Reno, where he was a Herz Gold Medal Winner.

At the school's Awards Ceremony on May 14, Dr. Stein was given the Dean's Scholar Award. This is given to the graduating senior who "has the compassion, skills and knowledge that are the hallmarks of a true physician; has demonstrated scholarship in each of his or her four years of medical school; has excelled in creative and scholarly activity outside the required curriculum; and consistently demonstrates the technical skills necessary to the practice of medicine and the caring and compassion that define the art of medicine."

While attending medical school, Dr. Stein earned the Outstanding Student in Basic

Bach Achievement in Physiology Award, the Excellence in Pathology Award, the American Academy of Family Physicians Research Award and the AMA Overall Excellence in Clinical Research Award. He also has been inducted into Alpha Omega Alpha, the national honorary medical society.
