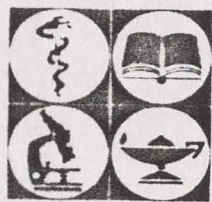

LAS VEGAS -- Mrs. Addie Tangredi, mother of four University of Nevada School of Medicine students (two graduates, one scheduled to graduate in May, and one incoming Freshman), will be named the 1992 Clark County Professional Mother of the Year at festivities to be held **Sunday, April 26** at the Grand Ballroom of the **Gold Coast** at **2 p.m.** Nine other Clark County women will be similarly honored in other categories at the 22nd annual gathering of this event.

School of Medicine officials nominated Mrs. Tangredi because of the guidance and support she has provided to each of her five children, all of whom have pursued medical education. Mrs. Tangredi is also co-president of the University of Nevada School of Medicine's Parents' Council and has been a driving force in the organization's fund raising efforts for the past eight years.

Tangredi's oldest daughter, Louise, is a 1989 graduate of the medical school and is presently a resident of obstetrics and gynecology at South Texas Medical Center in San

Antonio. Elizabeth Tangredi graduated in 1990 and is currently a resident in internal medicine at Good Samaritan Hospital in Phoenix. Raymond Tangredi will graduate from the medical school in May and youngest daughter, Christine, will be a member of the Class of 1996.
