Dr. Edwin Savlov, an internationally respected figure in surgical oncology, has been named chief of surgery at the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Reno. Dr. Savlov was recruited by the University of Nevada School of Medicine and will also be a professor in the school's surgery department.
