The University of Nevada School of Medicine will graduate 48 members of the Class of 1989 during commencement ceremonies on May 20 in Reno. This year, one of the members of the class, Randall F. Kloepfer, is a Billings resident.

Kloepfer earned his bachelor of science degree in health sciences from Boise State. While attending medical school in Nevada, he has been active in several organizations, including the American Medical Association and the American Medical Student Association, and also was a recipient of the Lange Book Award. This year he received the Merck Manual Award. He is the son of Virginia Kloepfer of Billings.

Kloepfer and his classmates will receive their academic hoods and take the Hippocratic Oath in a special professional ceremony--called "hooding"--on Friday, May 19. Students choose as their hooders someone who has contributed to their professional growth and development.
