Doctors learn about health care reform

LAS VEGAS--Health care reform, long a buzzword around the country, is quickly becoming reality for Las Vegas doctors. Physicians will learn how health care reform will affect them and their patients on Saturday, April 9, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., at the Tournament Players Club, Summerlin, during Health System Reform: A Physician's Guide to Survival.

The workshop is presented by the University of Nevada School of Medicine. It will include presentations outlining the three main health care reform proposals now pending before Congress; explaining the terminology; and helping physicians understand the process of negotiating contracts for services. The program will be moderated by Robert M. Daugherty, Jr., M.D., Ph.D., medical school dean, and will include discussion sessions on issues expected to have the greatest impact on how doctors care for their patients.
