Ames, M.D., is inviting the public, physicians and surgeons to attend his grand rounds lecture entitled "Organ Donation: A Patient's Perspective." The free seminar will be held on Thursday, April 18, 1996, at 5:00 p.m. on the sixth floor auditorium, 2040 W. Charleston Blvd.

Dr. Ames, Assistant Professor of Surgery at the University of Nevada School of Medicine, will discuss the overwhelming shortage of organ donors and the benefits of organ donation. This will be forum for potential recipients, donors, friends and family to talk about concerns, ask questions and learn the necessary information to make a lifegiving decision.
