Artist Nancy Peppin will present her watercolor exhibit, "Twinkie Madness" at the University of Nevada School of Medicine's Manville Gallery, May 6 through May 31.

"I like the feel of the immediacy and the permanence, as well as the luminous look of watercolor pigment on paper," says Peppin. "My style, which is very realistic, is very abstract at the same time, not only in exaggeration of perspective and the color of objects, but also in the size of the paintings."

The artist explains that the Twinkie landscapes are "abstract in themselves." She explains that the mountain ranges and beaches are "forever, will never spoil, and can't rot."

Peppin's paintings are done in a neutral tint throughout, with light color glazes added at the end of the process.

The opening reception for the May exhibit will be held on Monday, May 6, from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. The gallery is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and the public is welcome.
