The personal environment of artist Irene Lieberman will be portrayed when the November exhibit opens at the University of Nevada School of Medicine's Manville Gallery.

"My work is an attempt to portray my personal environment--the world I live in and come from," says Lieberman. "On reflection, I would say that most of my themes are auto-biographical."

Lieberman, who resides in Los Angeles, earned her undergraduate degree from Roosevelt University in Chicago, IL, and attended the University of California, Los Angeles.

The artist has had exhibitions at the Long Beach Association of Juried Drawing show in Long Beach, CA; the Bowers Museum in Santa Ana, CA; Downey Museum of Art in Downey, CA; and the Laguna College of Arts in Laguna, CA.

"The human presence is very important to me," she stresses, "and if the figure itself is not apparent in the painting, for me it is there in a letter to be read, a candle just lit, a sweater just removed."

The Lieberman exhibit begins with an opening reception on Monday, November 7, from 5 - 7 p.m., in the Manville Gallery and will run through the entire month.
