Bob Ross is the featured artist, and water paintings are the subject matter of the March exhibit at the University of Nevada School of Medicine's Manville Gallery. The opening reception is Monday, March 7, from 5 - 7 p.m.

"Water has an endless visual fascination," says Ross. "As a pretext for oil painting, it lends itself particularly well to a type of brush work and paint handling which intrigues me. My aim here is a demonstration of paint, stroke, composition, color and swing."

The artist, who is a resident of Fort Bragg, CA, attended Reed College in Portland, OR; Art Students' League in New York City; Yale Summer School of Music and Art in Norfolk, CT; and earned his bachelor of fine arts in 1965 from the Cooper Union Art School in New York City.

Ross has exhibited extensively, including solo shows at Linda's Restaurant, Los Angeles, CA; Creative Arts Center Gallery of the City of Sunnyvale, CA; Winona Gallery of Mendocino Art Center, Mendocino, CA; and Liberty Theatre, Palmer's Cafe, St. Helena, CA.

The Ross exhibit runs through the end of March. Gallery hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, and the public is welcome to come and browse. The gallery is partially supported by a grant from the Nevada State Council on the Arts.
