California artist Bonnie Lee Mott will display mixed media constructions in the February exhibit at the University of Nevada School of Medicine's Manville Gallery.

"My paintings are the way I delve into my unconscious depths," says Mott. "The making of them is the ritual I perform to discover my reality. I am continually startled to see what symbols emerge and what energies can be unleashed through surrender to the creative act. The work is completed only when I have had an experience with magic and never before that moment."

Mott earned her undergraduate degree from California State University at Northridge and her master's of fine arts from the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). She worked for three years in the art department at UCLA, and is now working for the Heritage Museum in Santa Monica.

She has exhibited extensively since 1983, including solo exhibitions at the Kerckhoff Art Gallery and the Wight Gallery at UCLA, the Student Union Art Gallery at San Francisco State University, the Guistina Gallery at Oregon State University, and Angel's Gate Cultural Center in San Pedro, CA.

Mott's exhibit begins with an opening reception on Monday, February 4 from 5 - 7 p.m. in the gallery, and runs through March 1. The gallery is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, and the public is welcome.
