"The process of doing one drawing is more constructive -- for an artist -- than all the chatter in the world," according to Bill Bryant, the artist being featured during December at the University of Nevada School of Medicine's Manville Gallery.

Bryant, an artist formerly from the Lake Tahoe area who is now living in Litchfield, NH, uses new materials, such as doors, and "old figures from the mind." Included in the exhibit are six doors which depict, on front and back, a split figure through which viewers can walk.

The artist has exhibited at ART in Truckee, CA, in 1985, and at Sierra Nevada College Theatre in Incline Village, NV, in 1986.

The opening reception for the Bryant exhibit is on Dec. 1, from 5 to 7 p.m., in the Manville Gallery. The exhibit will run through Jan. 2. and gallery hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. The gallery is partially supported by a grant from the Nevada State Council on the Arts.
