Artist and poet Kirk Robertson has been described by the Nevada State Council on the Arts as an artist who "has moved to a pure visual expression working through an elaborate series of commentaries on the land, its form, use and abuse."

Robertson, who is a Council artist-in-residence, will exhibit his works throughout March in the University of Nevada School of Medicine's Manville Gallery.

Born in Los Angeles, Robertson received his undergraduate degree in literature from California State University, Long Beach, in 1971. Since then, he has become an internationally known poet, publishing widely in books, magazines and anthologies.

As an artist, Robertson has exhibited extensively in Nevada including solo shows in the Alta Ham Fine Arts Gallery in Las Vegas; Sierra Nevada Museum of Art and Getchell Library in Reno; Northeastern Nevada Museum in Elko; Open Ring Galleries in Sacramento, and Churchill County Library and RoundHouse Gallery in Fallon.
