"I am a TV addict," admits artist Patricia (Trish) Andrews, whose show, "Some Other Channels," just opened at the University of Nevada School of Medicine's Manville Gallery.

Each piece in the show, which runs through the end of February, zeroes in on television and its influence on our lives. "I watch the morning news, the noon soaps and the evening rapes and murders," Andrews says. "The combination of living alone and being an artist has focused my attention on television.

"Its obnoxiously bland design is a forgiven element in the decor of home and public places," she adds. "Not only have I become more aware of the TV object as sculpture, I've also become aware of my personal relationship with TV. I can experience all things through television."

Andrews, who is an artist in residence of the Nevada State Council on the Arts, received her bachelor of arts degree in

sculpture, painting and photography from UNR in 1983. Since then, she has exhibited extensively in Nevada with shows in Sheppard Fine Arts Gallery, The Fine Arts Gallery at UNLV, Nevada Gallery in Gannet Publishing Company, Word O' Mouth Gallery and Getchell Gallery.

The artist also taught at the Brewery Arts Center in Carson City and for the Outdoor Education Art Center at the Katherine Dune School.
