The scenes are black and white and strange--scrawled words meandering over decrepit walls in an abandoned houses.

Residents of these bizarre abodes may be stuffed animals, plastic pool toys, a horse staring forlornly into an empty window, or even a person curled up in a child's wading pool.

And through it all are the cryptic words, flowing up walls, around windows, across floors and into debris-filled bathtubs. Other photographs capture stark landscapes, full of light and shadow.

New and selected works of David Arnold will include these and other images which will surprise, delight, and bemuse visitors to the Manville Gallery during the month of September. Arnold's show, "Some Photographs," opens on September 2 and continues through September 27.

"My work is serious, but not deadly serious," Arnold says.

"It's graffiti, or anti-graffiti." Then he adds, "But, then again, maybe not." Serious or not, Arnold has an extraordinary feel for black and white photography, with images that are vivid and full of contrast.
