"My work is created with a great deal of spontaneity, and is very much inspired by music," says artist Timothy Beckwith of his show "Musical Visions" which opens Aug. 5 at the University of Nevada School of Medicine's Manville Gallery.

Beckwith, who resides and works in San Luis Obispo, Ca., has a BFA with high distinction from California College of Arts and Crafts in Oakland, and has work in private collections in California and Oregon.

In addition to the Manville Gallery, Beckwith has shown his work at the Wood Duck Gallery in Morro Bay, Ca. and currently has pieces at the Tamara Webster Gallery in Cambria, Ca.

The show, which will run through Aug. 30, is mixed media of oil pastel, colored pencil, paint stick, and pencil on paper. The artist explains his work as being "expressive of the complex interactions among musical content, emotion and perception, and the way each influences the other, producing one experience."
