Abstract three-dimensional paintings by Los Angeles artist Paul Mlynic will be on display Jan. 7 - Feb. 7 in the Manville Gallery at the University of Nevada School of Medicine.

An opening reception for the exhibit, "Paintings in Three Dimensions," will be held Jan. 7, 5 - 7 p.m., in the gallery.

Mlynic's works are large expressionistic paintings, done in acrylic on polyvinyl sheets. Each piece consists of five to eight polyvinyl sheets suspended one behind the other, creating a volume of about six feet high by five feet wide and four feet deep.

The artist is a native of Los Angeles, and studied painting at University of California, Berkeley from 1971 - 1974. He became interested in 3-D imaging, and returned to school in engineering to develop a 3-D painting medium. He received his degree in computer engineering from UCLA in 1983, and is presently painting and working as a computer graphics engineer.

The Reno exhibit will be Mlynic's first show. His work was chosen from a number of slides submitted by artists from throughout the nation in response to an advertisement placed in Art Week.
