Pastels and prism colors spill over onto canvas and paper in "A Particular Sequence of Events," the December exhibit at Manville Gallery, University of Nevada School of Medicine.

The acrylic paintings, by Australian artist Janet Crennan, will be on display Dec. 3 - 28. An opening reception will be held from 5 to 7 p.m., Dec. 3, at the Gallery.

Born in New South Wales, Australia, Ms. Crennan has lived in several countries, including Geneva, Switzerland, where she worked for the United Nations.

She resides in Reno, where she works as a graphics designer at Studio 93. She earned her bachelor's degree in art from the University of Nevada Reno in 1979.

Ms. Crennan has successfully participated in arts competitions earning best of show, first and second place awards in juried and group shows. She has won awards and grants, including one from the Nevada State Council on the Arts. To date her work has been shown in Australia, Colorado, Utah, Nevada and California. Two of her drawings have been added to the permanent collection of the Somali Museum of Art in Somali.
