Congressional Notification

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is pleased to announce the award of \$100 million in homeless prevention grants to 151 non-profit community agencies in 49 states, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia as part of its expanding Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) Program. The SSVF program is a critical element of VA's plan to prevent and end homelessness among Veterans.

Through the SSVF Program, VA aims to improve very low-income Veteran families' housing stability. Grantees, which include private, non-profit organizations and consumer cooperatives, will provide supportive services to very low-income Veteran families living in or transitioning to permanent housing.
