AGENCY COMMENTS:

The Nevada Department of Wildlife (Department) appreciates notice of the proposed action and the opportunity to provide review relative to wildlife resources. We understand the intent of the proposed action is to issue a temporary non-renewable grazing authorization on the Ralston Allotment. The Ralston Allotment is vacant and considered as a Forage Reserve. The authorization would allow for 500 head of livestock from October 15, 2008 to May 10, 2009 on the East portion of the South Ralston Pasture and 100 head of livestock from November 1, 2008 to May 15, 2009 for the West Pasture of the Ralston Allotment.

Mindful that grazing would be temporary; we have identified wildlife resources in the East Portion of the South Pasture for management consideration as the proposed decision document is being developed. A number of Ferruginous Hawk, Golden Eagle and Prairie Falcon nest sites occur in this portion of the allotment, with potential for burrowing owls as well. Thus, it would be preferable for the East Portion of the South Allotment term to end by April 1 to reduce disturbance to breeding raptors. The dark kangaroo mouse (Microdipodops megacephalus) occurs in the allotment. This kangaroo mouse is a species of conservation priority for the Department and also classified as protected by the State of Nevada. A genetic evaluation is underway in order to determine taxonomic status of this species range wide. Lastly, Department personnel have noticed an increasing number of wild horses in the East Portion of the allotment which we believe to be outside of a Herd Management Area.
