The BLM is in the planning stages of developing another water source in a wild horse area of the Caliente Resource Area. The area is in the Applewhite Grazing Allotment directly south of Caliente. The permittee plans on extending an existing corral in the Taylor Mine Spring area and also installing a water trough in the corral extension. When this project is completed it will give the wild horses in this allotment an additional water source to drink from. When the corral is not in use by the rancher, the gates going into it will be left open for easy access by wildhorses and wildlife. I am writing this letter in response to a memo from our State Office stating whenever a project is to go into a wild horse area your organization is to be notified.
