I am considering a temporary nonrenewable use (TNR) grazing request by Raymond and Sandy Rosenlund for the <u>Ruby Valley Allotment (0619</u>). Authorization for this request is under Title 43 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Section 4130.6-2 (Nonrenewable grazing permits and lease). Mr. & Mrs. Rosenlund owns base property for the Ruby Valley Allotment. They are in good standing and meet all mandatory qualifications. The Ruby Valley Allotment is grazed in common by two permittees: Raymond and Sandy Rosenlund and Jack and Terry Bowers. The grazing use is as follows:

Rosenlunds have been authorized for their maximum permitted use for this grazing season. Rosenlunds have applied for an additional 178 AUMs active grazing use for the period 01/15/00 to 02/29/00. This application may be authorized after the comment period. Bowers have not made use in the Ruby Valley Allotment.

On December 8, 1999 an interdisciplinary team made a formal inspection of the Ruby Valley Allotment to determine if sufficient forage was available to support the authorization of the

temporary nonrenewable grazing request. Results of the rangeland monitoring inspection indicate that sufficient forage is available within the allotment to authorize the nonrenewable grazing use applied for in the grazing application. The Ruby Valley Allotment is in good condition and utilization objectives are being met. This use is consistent with multiple use objectives and does not interfere with existing livestock operations on the public lands. The Ruby Valley Allotment is located within the Buck and Bald Wild Horse Herd Management Area (HMA) and some wild horses are making use in the allotment.
