Dear Interested Public:

On May 13, 1997, a base property transfer was approved for Henry C. and Cheryl Vogler. The base property was formerly located in Tooele County, Utah. Currently, the base property is a fenced forty-acre parcel of private land located adjacent to Lookout Spring (T26N, R67E, S.29 NWSW) in White Pine County, Nevada. This private parcel serves as base property for the following federal livestock grazing privileges.

(0405) North Steptoe Allotment: 700 AUMs (Sheep) → Antelope
(0426) North Steptoe Trail: 253 AUMs (Sheep)

Mr. and Mrs. Vogler meet all of the qualifications for a grazing permittee outlined in 43 CFR 4110.1. A ten-year livestock grazing permit was issued on October 17, 1994, and complies with the regulations outlined in 43 CFR 4110.2-1 and 4110.2-2.

The terms and conditions outlined in the grazing permit, specific to the North Steptoe Allotment, were developed through consultation, cooperation, and coordination with the interested publics during the allotment evaluation process and are consistent with the North Steptoe Allotment Final Multiple Use Decision dated December 24, 1992.

These terms and conditions, and the impacts of livestock grazing under these terms and conditions, are consistent with and have been analyzed in the Egan Resource Management Plan and Environmental Impact Statement.

The North Steptoe Allotment is located within the Antelope Wild Horse Herd Management Area (HMA).
