Dear Public Land Interest:

The Egan Resource Area (ERA) is now in the process of evaluating the monitoring data on the following allotments (see the attached map for location-numbers keyed to map):

The purpose of an evaluation is to assess if current management practices are meeting the allotment specific and land use plan objectives as described in the Rangeland Program Summary (RPS), dated May 1988, and the Resource Management Plan (RMP), dated February 1987 for the ERA.

This fiscal year (1995) the ERA is scheduled to complete the evaluation process for these allotments through either an agreement or proposed decision, if they are in need of an adjustment of current management practices or to document the files if no change in current management is indicated by adequate monitoring data.

I request that those individuals and groups that have an interest in any or all of the listed allotments please submit by June 30, 1995, allotment specific data related to the allotment objectives described in the RPS. The information submitted will be used during the allotment evaluation process and to determine who is an affected interest and the nature of their interest.

The ERA will incorporate any pertinent allotment specific information provided by the public into the allotment evaluation, which will be completed through the technical recommendations portion. During the summer of 1995, the ERA will coordinate the review of the evaluation with the permittee and other affected interests that requested involvement through an allotment specific response to this inquiry.

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At this point the ERA will consider the input received from review of the evaluation by all the affected interests and plan to complete the final portion of the evaluation in August 1995. This consists of selection of management action(s) to be taken and subsequent development of a proposed decision, agreement, and/or documentation to the files if no change is recommended for the allotment.

It is my belief that the above described procedures provide the opportunity for permittees and other affected interests to be involved in and become informed of the conclusion of the evaluation process.



Dear Mr. Drais,

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to your scoping document dated January 30, 1995. The document was misfiled which has led to our delay in responding.

The Commission is an interested and affected party on wild horse issues in Nevada. The Nevada Legislature established by statute in 1991 that the Commission is the appropriate state agency in Nevada to be contacted on issues regarding wild horses and/or their habitat. The 1971 Wild Horse and Burro Act established that the Bureau of Land Management must consult the appropriate wildlife agencies in the state within which they are operating on wild horses. The Legislature designated the Commission as that appropriate agency.

Pursuant to the 1971 Wild Horse and Burro Act on the allotments listed in your scoping document as well as all areas covered by your District, please consider the Nevada Commission for the Preservation of Wild Horses an interested and affected party and State Agency designated by law to be contacted on all issues concerning wild horses and/or their habitat.

In your evaluations and pursuant proposed and final decision documents please include herd re-structuring pursuant to the Strategic Plan, recent and past population data, AUM calculations = mare/foal vs cow/calf, include your mathematical calculations re: weighted averaging and adjusted carry capacities, use pattern
