The new grazing regulations require the authorized officer to consult, cooperate, and coordinate (CCC) with affected permittees, the State agencies responsible for managing resources within the area, and the interested public prior to the issuance of grazing permits (43 CFR 4130.2(b)). Therefore, a copy of this letter and a copy of the acceptance form will be sent to individuals, groups or organizations that have expressed an interest in the management of livestock grazing on the above allotments.

The above applicants meet all of the qualifications for a grazing permittee outlined in 43 CFR 4110.1, and this transfer, offering, and issuance of a permit complies with the regulations governing transfers of grazing privileges and issuance of permits outlined in 43 CFR 4110.2-1, 4110.2-2 and 4110.2-3.

I am proposing to approve the transfers; however, prior to approval and the subsequent issuance of a new term permit, should you have any information, data, etc. that you would like to provide please do so prior to 1-30-98. Any comments in writing should be sent to the Caliente Field Station, P.O. Box 237, Caliente, NV 89008.

The terms and conditions outlined in the enclosed acceptance forms are those which have historically appeared on previous annual licenses and permits authorizing grazing use in these allotments. The terms and conditions outlined are also consistent with the Caliente Field Station Management Framework Plan. The impacts of livestock grazing under these terms and conditions have been analyzed in the Caliente Environmental Impact Statement.

If we propose to change the terms and conditions of these grazing permits, following the comment period, we will keep you and other interested parties informed. If we determine that it is necessary to offer you this permit via proposed decision, it will be sent to the interested public and will include a 15-day period for protest and a 30-day period for appeal.

- 10. All vehicle use in desert tortoise habitat within the Snow Springs allotment shall be restricted to existing roads and trails.
- 11. Trash and garbage shall be removed from each camp site that is associated with livestock grazing operations (branding, sheep herding, roundup, etc.) and disposed of off site in a designated facility. No trash or garbage shall be buried at camp sites.
- 12. Use of hay or grains as a feeding supplemental shall be prohibited in desert tortoise habitat to avoid the introduction of non-native plant species. Mineral, protein and salt blocks are authorized subject to 43 CFR section 4130.6-2(c).
- 13. - 17. Adequate livestock control must be provided by existing range improvements within the Snow Springs allotment to prevent livestock from continually migrating into the Prescription 1 area during the period 03/01 through 05/15 If livestock continually migrate into the Prescription 1 area, the entire allotment will be required to be managed under Prescription 1 until range improvements become available to stop such action.

Applications for changes in grazing use which require the issuance of a replacement or supplemental billing notice shall be subject to a ten (10) dollar service charge.
- 3. Grazing applications will be issued on a yearly basis. If you do not sign and return your grazing application by the date specified on the application you will receive a bill for all of your active livestock grazing permitted use. If you wish to place all or a portion of your active livestock grazing use into non-use for the grazing year, you must indicate this in writing on your grazing application, along with your reasons for doing so. Any use in excess of your active grazing preference is non-renewable.
- 4. Signed Actual Use Statements are due annually to the Caliente Resource Area Office within 15 days after completing annual grazing use. In the case of year round grazing, Actual Use Statements must be received in our office by March 15.
- 5. The term Federal grazing permit is subject to cancellation, suspension, or modification for any violation of the Code of Federal Regulations or specified terms or conditions of this permit.
- 6. Authorized use shall be made in accordance with the Crossroads and Barclay Allotment Management Plans as approved on October 21, 1988 and October 6, 1981 respectively.
- 7. Pursuant to 43 CFR 10.4(g) the holder of this authorization must notify the authorized officer by telephone, with written confirmation, immediately upon discovery of human remains, funerary objects, sacred objects, or objects of cultural patrimony (as defined at 43 CFR 10.2). Further, pursuant to 43 CFR 10.4 (C) and (d), you must stop activities in the vicinity of the discovery and protect it for 30 days or until notified to proceed by the authorized officer.
