Dear Public Land Interest:

The Egan Resource Area (ERA) is now in the process of evaluating the monitoring data on the following allotments (see the attached map for locations-numbers keyed to map):

The purpose of an evaluation is to assess if current management practices are meeting the allotment specific and land use plan objectives as described in the Rangeland Program Summary (RPS), dated May 1988, and the Resource Management Plan (RMP) dated February 1987 for the ERA.

This fiscal year (1994) the ERA is scheduled to complete the evaluation process for these allotments through either an agreement or proposed decision, if they are in need of an adjustment of current management practices, or to document the files if no change in current management is indicated by adequate monitoring data.

I request that those individuals and groups that have an interest in any or all of the listed allotments please submit by June 30, 1994, allotment specific data related to the allotment objectives described in the RPS. The information submitted will be used during the allotment evaluation process and to determine who is an affected interest and the nature of their interest.

The ERA will incorporate any pertinent allotment specific information provided by the public into the allotment evaluation, which will be completed through the technical recommendations portion. During the summer of 1994, the ERA will coordinate the review of the evaluation with the permittee and other affected interests that requested involvement through an allotment specific response to this inquiry.

At this point the ERA will consider the input received from review of the evaluation by all the affected interests and plan to complete the final portion of the evaluation in August 1994. This consists of selection of management action(s) to be taken and subsequent development of a proposed decision, agreement, and/or documentation to the files if no change is recommended for the allotment.

It is my belief that the above described procedures provide the opportunity for permittees and other affected interests to be involved in and become informed of the conclusion of the evaluation process.



Thank you for the scoping letter regarding the evaluation in

Allotments numbered 0829, 0832, 0609, and 0607.

For those allotments having all or portions of HMA's we request you consider the following information; as part of the evaluation process.

1) Making sure BLM Instruction Memorandums, Policies, regulations, are followed and signed off by the specialist.

2) Elimination of inconsistent management between resource areas or Districts on the same HMA.

- 3) We request that if the BLM allocates one AUM per cow/calf that the BLM use the same for mare/foal for the first six months.
- 4) If you propose reductions in livestock and/or wild horses and you use "full force and effect," that you apply that full force against the offending animals.
- 5) During the evaluation, technical recommendations of these allotment, that you remember that all or potions of these allotment is a herd area. That fencing and complex grazing pasture systems will impede wild horse use and movement of their only range.
- 6) That you evaluate and allocate from the HMA perspective, not the allotment perspective.

Please consider us on everything affecting wild horses and burros and/or their habitat.
