
1. Livestock grazing use and management actions will be in accordance with the agreement for implementation of changes in livestock grazing use on the Deep Creek Allotment dated February 2000.
2. Water will be made available, naturally or hauled, at the following reservoirs/sites during livestock use:
  - Deep Creek Reservoir #1 - T. 26 N., R. 70 E., Sec. 28
  - Deep Creek Reservoir #2 - T. 25 N., R. 70 E., Sec. 6
  - Deep Creek Reservoir #3 - T. 25 N., R. 70 E., Sec. 29
3. Specified water hauling sites will be identified through coordination, cooperation and consultation with the BLM and the above permittees. Water hauling and hauling sites maybe changed if permanent water is developed.
4. Authorized grazing use during April and May will be in accordance with the following allowable use levels;
  - During April utilization levels will not exceed 50% on the uplands and 40% on the riparian areas on the Utah and Nevada portions of the allotment.
  - During May utilization levels will not exceed 40% on the uplands and 30% on the riparian areas on the Utah and Nevada portions of the allotment.
5. If utilization levels are reached, cattle will be moved to areas where utilization levels have not reached the above levels or cattle will be removed from the allotment.
6. The authorized officer is requiring that an actual use report (form 4130-5) be submitted within 15 days after completing your annual grazing use.
