Dear Mr. Melchor Gragirena,

Your grazing permit\lease No. 274442, previously issued for the period from 03/01/00 to 02/28/01, will be replaced by a new term grazing permit for a one year period from 03/01/01 to 02/28/02. The term grazing permit is being reissued because standards were recently identified as not being met. Changes in grazing management are being implemented to meet those standards. These changes were implemented through the Annual Agreement for Implementation of Changes In Livestock Grazing Use on the Majors and South Spring Valley Allotments. This is the second year of implementation of these changes. The Bureau of Land Management is currently taking actions required to process the renewal of your permit\lease. I propose to offer you a new term permit for the Wilson Creek, Majors and South Spring Valley Allotments (Selective Management Categories I, M and M respectively) and the Shoshone Unit Trail.

The new grazing regulations require the authorized officer to consult, cooperate, and coordinate (CCC) with affected permittees, the State agencies responsible for managing resources within the area, and the interested public prior to the issuance of grazing permits (43 CFR 4130.2(b)). Therefore, a copy of this letter and a copy of the acceptance form will be sent to individuals, groups or organizations that have expressed an interest in the management of livestock grazing on the Wilson Creek, Majors and South Spring Valley Allotments and the Shoshone Unit Trail.

You meet all of the qualifications for a grazing permittee outlined in 43 CFR 4110.1, and this offering and issuance of a permit complies with the regulations governing issuance of permits outlined in 43 CFR 4110.2-1 and 4110.2-2.

The terms and conditions outlined in the enclosed acceptance form are those which were developed through an agreement for implementation of changes in livestock grazing use on the Majors and South Spring Valley Allotments accepted March 5, 2001. This term permit will be issued until February 28, 2002 to coincide with the signed grazing agreement. The terms and conditions outlined are also consistent with the Schell Resource Area Management Framework Plan (MFP), the Schell Grazing Environmental Impact Statement and the subsequent Record of Decision.

An Environmental Assessment has been completed for issuance of this proposed term permit. The proposed grazing use is within the array of options identified for the alternatives and proposed action

as analyzed in the Schell Grazing Environmental Impact Statement.

The terms and conditions outlined for the Majors and South Spring Valley Allotments were developed through consultation, cooperation and coordination with the interested public during the allotment evaluation process. Majors and South Spring Valley Allotments are not located within the a Wild Horse Herd Management Area. Wilson Creek Allotment is located within the Wilson Creek, Seaman and Dry Lake Herd Management Areas. A portion of the Shoshone Unit Trail is located within the Dry Lake Herd Management Area.

If we propose to change the terms and conditions of this grazing permit, following the comment period, we will keep you and other interested parties informed. If we determine that it is necessary to offer you this permit via proposed decision, it will be sent to the interested public and will include a 15-day period for protest and a 30-day period for appeal.

The interested public is being asked to provide comments by March 20, 2001. Any comments in writing should be sent to James M. Perkins, Assistant Field Manager-Renewable Resources at the above address.

Cattle use will not exceed 1,703 AUMs in South Spring Valley Allotment and 2,183 AUMs active use in Majors Allotment with 503 AUMs held in voluntary nonuse for conservation and protection of natural resources. 4,226 sheep AUMs and 9,326 sheep AUMs will be held in voluntary nonuse for the conservation and protection of natural resources in Spring Valley and Majors Allotment respectively.

Authorized grazing use in Majors during April and May will be in accordance with the following allowable use levels;

Winterfat utilization will not exceed 30% of current year growth during spring use. Utilization levels on grasses will not exceed 40% of current year growth.

Authorized grazing use in South Spring Valley during December, January. February and March will be in accordance with the following allowable use levels;

Winterfat utilization will not exceed 50% of current year growth during winter use. Utilization levels on grasses will not exceed 55% of current year growth.

If utilization levels are reached, cattle will be moved to areas where utilization levels have not reached the above levels or cattle will be removed from the allotment. Failure to meet utilization levels will result in changes to period-of-use and stocking levels the following year.

Locate salt and/or mineral supplements for cattle at locations no closer than one mile from water sources.

South Spring Valley Allotment:

Cattle will be authorized on the allotment from 12/09 through 03/10 pending evaluation of the change to a winter season of use on the calf crop and forage resources. This evaluation will be completed in late April or May. Cattle will be distributed evenly

through out the allotment using herding and placement of salt and/or mineral supplements. Cattle will be authorized in the northeastern portion of the allotment from 06/01 through 06/15. The primary forage utilized at this time will be saltgrasses.

Majors Allotment:

Water will be hauled to the following temporary sites along existing roads while livestock are authorized in the use areas:

John Henry Wash Use Area in T. 13 N., R. 66 E., Sec. 9 and approximately Sec. 20.

South Majors Use Area in T. 13 N., R. 66 E., Scc. 24.

North Majors Use Area in T. 14 N., R. 66 E., Sec. 33 (a site that had been used in previous years is located in Sec. 1 SE).

Cleve Creek Use Area in T. 15 N., R. 66 E., Sec. 11 and Sec. 2.

Bastian Creek Use Area in T. 14 N., R. 66 E., Sec. 3 (which will be located higher on the bench.)

Osceola Use Area in T. 14 N., R. 67 E., Sec. 21 (Private Land, Crystal Queen Mine), Sec. 23, Sec. 11, Sec. 10 NENE, T. 15 N., R. 67 Sec. 34 and on the east side of U. S. Highway 6 & 50, Sec. 26,

Office Stipulations are as follows:

Livestock numbers identified in the term grazing permit are a function of seasons of use and permitted use for each allotment. Deviations from those livestock numbers and seasons of use may be authorized on an annual basis where such deviations would not prevent attainment of the Multiple-Use Objectives for the above allotment(s).

Deviations from specified grazing use dates will be allowed when consistent with Multiple-Use Objectives. Such deviations will require an application and written authorization from the authorized officer prior to grazing.

Sheep will continually be moved, sheep will be moved a minimum of five miles a day when trailing, and not be allowed to bed within a 1/4 mile of live water.

The authorized officer is requiring that an actual use report (form 4130-5) be submitted within 15 days after completing your annual grazing use.

The payment of your grazing fees is due on or before the date specified in the grazing bill. This date is generally the opening date of your allotment. If payment is not received within 15 days of the due date, you will be charged a late fee assessment of

\$25.00 or 10 percent of the grazing bill, whichever is greater, not to exceed \$250.00. Payment with VISA, MasterCard or American Express is accepted. Failure to make payment within 30 days of the due date may result in trespass action.

Pursuant to 43 CFR 10.4(G) the holder of this authorization must notify the authorized officer by telephone, with written confirmation, immediately upon discovery of human remains, funerary objects, sacred objects, or objects of cultural patrimony (as defined at 43 CFR 10.2). Further, pursuant to 43 CFR 10.4 (C) and (D), you must stop activities in the immediate vicinity of the discovery and protect it from your activities for 30 days or until notified to proceed by the authorized officer.

Grazing will be in accordance with the Northeastern Great Basin Area Standards and Guidelines for grazing administration as developed by the Northeastern Great Basin Resource Advisory Council and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on February 12, 1997. Grazing use will also be in accordance with 43 CFR subpart 4180 - Fundamentals of Rangeland Health and Standards and Guidelines for grazing administration.

RANGE IMPROVEMENTS

Work on Blind Springs, located in the South Spring Valley Allotment, will be coordinated between the BLM and permittee. The Murphy Wash Pipeline (#554497) will be evaluated to determine if burying the pipeline will alleviate the freezing conditions experienced in January 2001.

MONITORING PROGRAM

The South Spring Valley and Majors Allotment will continue to be monitored through measured utilization and use pattern mapping. The BLM and El Tejon Cattle Company agree to jointly conduct monthly monitoring inspections for the South Spring Valley and Majors Allotments. Monitoring will be conducted to determine utilization levels and grazing use patterns. Prior to authorizing grazing use monitoring will be conducted to determine forage availability, grazing use areas and grazing management practices. Following the grazing period monitoring will be conducted to determine utilization levels.

ANNUAL EVALUATION

Following the annual grazing period BLM and El Tejon Cattle Company will evaluate grazing use and determine if stocking levels were within allowable use levels. If adjustments are needed to achieve allowable use levels they will be developed at that time and will be implemented the next grazing year. Adjustments may include changes to period-of-use, stocking levels, areas-of-use or other grazing management practices. BLM and El Tejon will coordinate regarding a change in period-of-use for South Spring Valley which could be finalized this grazing year. In discussion with the permittee, it is the goal to change South Spring Valley to a winter operation with dates from December through March of each year.
