NOTICE OF ASSISTANT DISTRICT MANAGER'S PROPOSED DECISION

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Hall:

I have reviewed your request for transfer of grazing privileges of the Pumpernickel and Rock Creek Allotments. I have determined that you are a qualified applicant and that the above listed allotments are designated as available for livestock grazing through the Sonoma-Gerlach Management Framework Plan.

I have further determined that the Terms and Conditions which you are offered are appropriate to achieve the management and resource condition objectives for the allotments and that they will ensure conformance with 43 CFR 4180 (Fundamentals of Rangeland Health). Both allotments are in the process of evaluating management actions and should be completed this year. At this time your term permit will be offered for a year to allow for completion of the evaluations. Once the Final Multiple Use Decisions are finalized, I will issue you a 10 year permit reflecting the technical recommendations of the Multiple Use Decisions.

In the mean time, my proposed decision is to offer you the attached Grazing Permit.

Rationale:

The Code of Federal Regulations require (43 CFR 4130.2(a)) that, "Grazing permits or leases shall be issued to qualified applicants to authorize use on the public lands and other lands under the administration of the Bureau of Land Management that are designated as available for livestock grazing through land use plans."

43 CFR 4130.3 states that, "Livestock grazing permits and leases shall contain terms and conditions determined by the authorized officer to be appropriate to achieve the management and

resource condition objectives for the public lands and other lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management, and to ensure conformance with the provisions of subpart 4180 of this part."

Authority: The authority of this decision is contained in Title 43 of the Code of Federal Regulations, which states in pertinent parts:

4100.08 "The authorized officer shall manage livestock grazing on public lands under the principles of multiple use and sustained yield and in accordance with applicable land use plans. Land use plans shall establish allowable resource uses (either singly or in combination), related levels of production or use to be maintained, areas of use, and resource condition goals and objectives to be obtained. The plans also set forth program constraints and general management practices needed to achieve management objectives. Livestock grazing activities and management actions approved by the authorized officer shall be in conformance with the land use plan as defined at 43 CFR 1601.05(b)."

4130.2(a) "Grazing permits or leases shall be issued to qualified applicants to authorize use on the public lands and other lands under the administration of the Bureau of Land Management that are designated as available for livestock grazing through land use plans. Permits or leases shall specify the types and levels of use authorized, including livestock grazing, suspended use, and conservation use. These grazing permits or leases shall also specify terms and conditions pursuant to 4130.3, 4130.31, and 4130.32"

4130.2(b) "The authorized officer shall consult, cooperate and coordinate with affected permittees or lessees, the State having lands or responsible for managing resources within the area, and the interested publics prior to the issuance or renewal of grazing permits and leases.

4130.3 "Livestock grazing permits and leases shall contain terms and conditions determined by the authorized officer to be appropriate to achieve the management and resource objectives for the public lands and other lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management, and to ensure conformance with the provisions of subpart 4180 of this part."

4130.31(a) "The authorized officer shall specify the kind and number of livestock, the period(s) of use, the allotment(s) to be used, and the amount of use, in animal unit months, for every grazing permit or lease. The authorized livestock grazing use shall not exceed the livestock carrying capacity of the allotment."

4130.32 "The authorized officer may specify in grazing permits or leases other terms and conditions which will assist in achieving management objectives, provide for proper range management or assist in the orderly administration of the public rangelands..."

4160.1(a) "Proposed decisions shall be served on any affected applicant, permittee, or lessee and any agent and lien holder of record, who is affected by the proposed actions, terms or conditions, or modification relating to applications, permits and agreements (including range improvement permits) or leases, by certified mail or personal delivery. Copies of proposed decisions shall also be sent certified to the interested publics."

4160.2 "Any applicant, permittee, lessee, or other affected interests may protest the proposed decisions under Sec. 4160.1 of this title in person or in writing to the authorized officer within 15 days after receipt of such decision."

Protests:

Any applicant, permittee, lessee, or other affected interests may protest the proposed decisions under Sec. 43 CFR 4160.1, in person or in writing to:

within 15 days after receipt of such decision. The protest, if filed, should clearly and concisely state the reason(s) as to why the proposed decision is in error.

In the absence of a protest, the proposed decision will become my final decision .

Any applicant, permittee, lessee or other person whose interest is adversely affected by the final decision may file an appeal and petition for stay of the decision pending final determination on appeal under 43 CFR 4160.4, § 4.21 and § 4.470. The appeal and petition for stay must be filed in the office of the authorized officer, noted above, within 30 days following receipt of the final decision, or 30 days after the date the proposed decision becomes final.

The appeal shall state the reasons, clearly and concisely, why the appellant thinks the final decision is in error.

Should you wish to file a motion for stay, the appellant shall show sufficient justification based on the following standards:

(1) The relative harm to the parties if the stay is granted or denied.

(2) The likelihood of the appellant's success on the merits.

(3) The likelihood of immediate and irreparable harm if the stay is not granted, and

(4) Whether the public interest favors granting the stay.

As noted above the petition for stay must be filed in the office of the authorized officer.

LINE O2 IS TO BE GRAZED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ROCK CREEK AMP AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AGREEMENT SIGNED ON DECEMBER 13,1988. ALL USE IN THE DIAMOND S ALLOTMENT SHALL BE USED FOR TRAILING AND BE BASED ON 51 AUMS ON YOUR INTERMINGLED DEEDED LANDS AND A TRAILING APPLICATION FILED WITH THE BLM. ACTUAL USE REFORTS ARE DUE 15 DAYS AFTER COMPLETING YOUR GRAZING USE.
