Dear Ms. Lappin:

In response to the increase in wild horse and burro numbers in the Winnemucca District on the Soldier Meadows allotment in the Sonoma-Gerlach Resource Area, and on the Paiute Meadows allotment in the Paradise-Denio Resource Area, we have proposed to reduce the herd sizes to interim management levels of 200 and 182 animals respectively. This will involve the removal of approximately 1100 wild horses from both public and private lands. A detailed inventory will be conducted prior to the roundup to determine the exact number of animals to be removed.

The magnitude of wild horse numbers has caused a significant decrease in the percentage of ground cover and is contributing to increased soil erosion problems, plus increased wildlife and livestock competition for forage.

The roundup has been tentatively scheduled to begin this summer or fall, depending on the availability of funds, and will continue until the proposed number of horses has been captured.

It is not anticipated that any harassment to the wildlife populations will occur during the trapping operation.

In accordance with Section 14 of the Public Rangelands Improvement Act of 1978 (P.L. 95-514), we invite your comments concerning the proposed gathering.
