Hi Cathy:

You wanted to know if we went 20% below AML, as Terry Woosley thought, on our last Calico Complex Gather. Here is the information you requested.

An estimated 2781 horses and burros were to be captured with 2207 horses (20% below AML) to be remove. A total of 2505 horses and burros were captured and 2092 removed. A total of 411 horses and 2 burros were released. This should have taken us to at least 20% below AML, since the gather was supposed to be a total capture. It was assumed from Jim Hicks verbal report that a few horses would not come to the trap. We left a 145 horse and 17 burro buffer between what was released and the AML to allow for what Jim said was left out there. There are a few holes in the California/Nevada state boundary fences in the Warm Springs Canyon and Calico HMAs. It is known that horses move back and forth between the two

state areas through these holes. This could account for the lack of horses during the gather and the additional horses the next summer during the census.

Hope this answers any questions you may have. We, in good faith, went at least 20% below AML at the time of the gather.
