Dear Reader:

This letter is to inform you that the Winnemucca District plans to remove excess wild horses from the Buffalo Hills and Granite Range Herd Management Area's (HMA) from November 1, 1995 to November 30, 1995. The removal is a continuation of the implementation of the NOTICE OF FINAL FULL FORCE AND EFFECT MULTIPLE USE DECISION, BUFFALO HILLS ALLOTMENT dated February 9, 1993, which established the Appropriate Management Level (AML) for the Buffalo Hills and Granite Range HMA's. This removal constitutes no new decision, since current monitoring data indicates that the established AML is valid and that the capture methods remain the same as stated in the Buffalo Hills and Granite Range Wild Horse Removal Plan and Environmental Assessment dated February 9, 1993. The removal is in conformance with the Wild Free Roaming Horse and Burro Act of 1971 (P.L. 92-195) section 3(b)(1) and (2), as amended.

The intent of the removal is to achieve AML, and to initiate management of the wild horse population within the ranges established in the NOTICE OF FINAL FULL FORCE AND EFFECT MULTIPLE USE DECISION, BUFFALO HILLS ALLOTMENT. However, due to the population level in the Granite Range HMA, it is anticipated that the post removal population will exceed AML. As stated in the Buffalo Hills and Granite Range Wild Horse Removal Plan, the primary emphasis will be on removing animals that are 5 years old or younger. However, based on current policy, horses up to nine years of age may be removed. On the Granite Range HMA, horses up to nine years of age may be removed in an attempt to achieve AML.

The following table lists the management range and the estimated current wild horse population for the Buffalo Hills and Granite Range HMA's. The estimated population is based on an August 1995 census.

Management Range Population

HMA 75% of AML to AML

Buffalo Hills 235 to 314 381

Granite Range 193 to 258 674
