Dear Mr. and Mrs. Schutte:

Your request to renew your grazing permit for the Big Springs Allotment was received on May 15, 1996. The signed "Acceptance of Terms and Conditions" form was also received on May 15, 1996. Based on your acceptance of the terms and conditions, we propose to offer you a term grazing permit effective for the length of the base property lease (May 16, 1996 to May 15, 1999). This permit would be renewed upon renewal of your base property lease, not to exceed ten years.

The new grazing regulations require the authorized officer to consult, cooperate, and coordinate (CCC) with affected permittees, the State agencies responsible for managing resources within the area, and the interested public prior to the issuance of grazing permits (43 CFR 4130.2(b)). Therefore, a copy of this letter and a copy of the acceptance form will be sent to anyone who has expressed an interest in the Big Springs Allotment. (See the attached map for the location of the allotment.) The interested public is being asked to provide comment by May 31, 1996. We plan to issue you a temporary use authorization pending completion of the public consultation process.

The terms and conditions outlined in the attached acceptance form are those which have historically appeared on previous annual licenses and permits authorizing grazing use in this allotment. A portion of the Goshute Wild Horse Herd Management Area is located on the eastern edge of this allotment.

The terms and conditions outlined are consistent with the Wells Resource Management Plan. The impacts of livestock grazing under these terms and conditions have been analyzed in the Wells Resource Management Plan Environmental Impact Statement. An Administrative Determination of National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Compliance has been completed and is available at the Elko District Office. A monitoring evaluation of the Big Springs Allotment has been initiated and is planned to be completed in 1997.

If we propose to change the terms and conditions of your grazing permit, following the comment period, we will keep you and other interested parties informed.

Terms and Conditions

Grazing is prohibited on white sage and saltbush areas between April 1 and October 31 of each year.

Your grazing use area will be limited to that area east of the crest of the Pequop Mountains south of I-80 and east of the rangeline that separates R. 65 E. from R. 66 E. north of I-80 as outlined in the rangeline agreement signed and authorized on September 5, 1990.

Submit actual use reports for the Big Springs Allotment describing use by livestock number and kind, dates of use, and pasture or geographic area of use. Submit your Big Springs actual use report by November 15 annually. Describe all grazing use made from November 1 of the previous year through October 30 of the current year.

Supplemental feeding is limited to salt, mineral and/or protein supplements in block, granular or liquid form. Such supplements must be placed at least ¼ mile from live waters (springs and streams), troughs, wet or dry meadows, and aspen stands.


All riparian exclosures, including spring development exclosures, are closed to livestock use unless specifically authorized in writing.

Payment of grazing fees is due on or before the due date specified on the grazing bill. Failure to pay the grazing bill within 15 days of the due date specified on the bill shall result in a late fee assessment of \$25.00 or 10 percent of the grazing bill, whichever is greater, but not to exceed \$250.00

The term of the Grazing Permit will be From May 16, 1996 to May 15, 1999.
