Dear Mr. Bingham:

Your application for an extension of use on the Ferber Flat Allotment from 4/21/97 to 4/30/97 was received on 4/8/97. Your existing grazing permit allows for grazing use from 11/10 to 4/20 annually. As per the new grazing regulations which became effective on 8/22/95, the authorized officer is required to consult, cooperate and coordinate with various parties including the interested public prior to the issuance of non-renewable grazing permits. Consulting with the interested public allows the BLM the opportunity to consider the most complete information when making decision. As a result of the consultation process, the BLM received comments and concerns from the Animal Protection Institute (API) and the Commission for the Preservation of Wild Horses. The Commission requested additional information pertaining to pre-livestock use by wild horses and API felt that a deviation from the permit dates should not be allowed as they felt this deviation would result in a further loss of forage for wild horses.

The Approved Wells Resource Area Wild Horse Amendment outlined specific combined winter use areas by livestock and wild horses that would be monitored prior to livestock turnout. It was determined that limiting wild horses to 10% utilization levels on key forage species prior to the turnout of livestock would result in combined utilization that would meet multiple use objectives. Although the Ferber Flat Allotment does fall within the combined winter use areas where the 10% utilization level applies, aerial census flights over the last ten year period have never shown a wild horse on the allotment. Therefore, the Elko Field Office has determined it not necessary to collect pre-livestock utilization data on the Ferber Flat Allotment (should aerial census data show a change in the horse distribution in the future, vegetation monitoring will be adjusted accordingly). Data collected at the end of the grazing season over the last ten years shows an average utilization on key forage species of 38% on shrubs and 30% on grasses. These utilization figures are well within the objective levels.

I have given the comments received pertaining to the change in period of use in the Ferber Flat Allotment careful consideration. Based on my review of the comments received, I have determined that authorizing livestock grazing use from 4/21 to 4/30 this year would not affect the attainment or non-attainment of the multiple use objectives for the Ferber Flat Allotment. API and the Commission are being provided with a copy of the grazing license and a map of the allotment which are enclosed. In addition to the existing terms and conditions, the following terms and conditions will apply:

The change in the period of use (4/21/97 through 4/30/97) is authorized as a change in the period of use, and will not result in a permanent change to your grazing permit.

All livestock use will be confined to the Little Whitehorse Pass and surrounding vicinity.


