### Transfer of Grazing Privileges on the Ferber Flat Allotment

Dear Interested Public:

Sherie R. Goring has submitted a request to transfer grazing privileges on the Ferber Flat Allotment from Earl Bingham Ranch Partnership to herself. The full permitted use of 2,735 AUMs would be transferred. The Ferber Flat Allotment is located approximately 30 miles south of Wendover, Nevada, and is normally grazed by sheep from November 1 to April 20 each year. Based on the transfer application, we propose to offer a term grazing permit. The term of this permit would be from November 1, 2000 to October 31, 2010, but may be modified this coming year as a result of the Sheep Complex Evaluation which was distributed for public comment this past summer. This allotment is within the Antelope Valley Wild Horse Herd Management Area.

The new grazing regulations require the authorized officer to consult, cooperate, and coordinate (CCC) with affected permittees, the State agencies responsible for managing resources within the area, and the interested public prior to the issuance of grazing permits (43 CFR 4130.2(b)). Therefore, a copy of this letter and a copy of the acceptance form will be sent to anyone who has expressed an interest in the Ferber Flat Allotment. **The interested public is being asked to provide comment within 15 days of the date of this letter.** You will be notified of any changes to terms and conditions that may be warranted as a result of comments received.

If we propose to change the terms and conditions following the comment period, we will keep you and the other interested parties informed. Following the comment period, we will also decide if a proposed decision to offer Sherie R. Goring a term grazing permit will be needed. If a proposed decision is necessary, it will be sent to the interested public and will include a 15-day period for protest and a 30-day period for appeal after the decision has become final.

The terms and conditions of the grazing permit are attached and are consistent with the Wells Resource Management Plan.

I, Sherie R. Goring agree to accept the Terms & Conditions listed below and request that we be offered a Grazing Permit to graze the allotment in which we have applied for a grazing preference.

*Terms and Conditions:*

There are no historic suspended AUMs attached to this grazing permit.

Actual use data must be submitted to this office within 15 days from the last day of use.

Pursuant 43 CFR 10.4(g) the holder of this authorization must notify the authorized officer, by telephone, with written confirmation, immediately upon the discovery of human remains, funerary items, sacred objects, or objects of cultural patrimony. Further, pursuant to 43 CFR 10.4(c) and (d), you must stop activities in the immediate vicinity of the discovery and protect it from your activities for 30 days or until notified to proceed by the authorized officer.

The terms and conditions of your permit may be modified if additional information indicates that revision is necessary to conform to 43 CFR 4180.

Supplemental feeding is limited to salt, mineral, and/or protein supplements in block, granular, or liquid form. Such supplements must be placed at least ¼ mile from live waters (springs and streams), troughs, wet or dry meadows, and aspen stands.

All riparian exclosures, including spring development exclosures, are closed to livestock use unless specifically authorized in writing.

Payment of grazing fees is due on or before the due date specified on the grazing bill. Failure to pay the grazing bill within 15 days of the due date specified on the bill shall result in a late fee assessment of \$25.00 or 10 percent of the grazing bill, whichever is greater, but not to exceed \$250.00.


The term of this permit would be from November 1, 2000 to October 31, 2010.
