MONTGOMERY PASS

I hope all is well with you. I am writing to update you on the Horse Territory (MPWHT). First, we have completed the 1993 horse counts based on ground surveys and fixed-wing/helicopter censuses. I will be compiling the data into a summary in November/December and will send you a copy for the CRMP file.

The mountain lion portion of the database is in the process of collation, and this will include 1987-1993 compilations. This year, as in previous years, predation on foals was significant and has continued into the Fall. We have expanded our efforts on lion monitoring, with 3 new lions radiocollared this year. Also, Dr. Mike Morrison (U.C., Berkeley/U. Arizona) has joined our research effort and will spearhead the lion work from this point forward. I have also requested and received approval (see attached letter) for closure of the Nevada side of the area to lion hunting as of September 1993. This will last until rescinded, at least until 1998. We are also beginning discussions with California Fish and Game about working lions in California again.

Regarding the horse nutritional data and summer range forage preferences, Linda Coates-Markle has done an impressive job this Summer and Fall. The tireless, dedicated effort by Linda and her assistant, Katia, has produced a wealth of data which will be analyzed as Linda progresses with her doctoral thesis. Valuable horse i.d. data were also obtained during their work. Linda will contoue next year with this effort, and Katia has expressed interest in joining the lion research effort in pursuit of a M.S. degree.

I have attempted to keep Bonnie Pritchard informed of these activities. While I was unsure earlier this summer of Bonnie's interest in these efforts, she set-up and participated in the September Utilization and Census in committed, efficient fashion. We have since discussed the MPWHT and our respective goals and concerns, and I believe that we both feel that things will continue to proceed well.

It is my continuing belief that the CRMP for the MPWHT, with integration of research and its application to management, is an excellent program, and that the MPWHT stands out as a successful model of sound resource management.


