Gather and remove wild horses from the High Rock Herd Management Area

WILDERNESS AREAS:

Background

Portion of the High Rock Herd Management Area (HMA) are within the High Rock Canyon, East Fork High Rock Canyon and Little High Rock Canyon wilderness areas (see attached map).

An Appropriate Management Level (AML) for the wild horse population within the High Rock HMA is established at a range of 78–120 animals in environmental assessments CA-028-93-03, and CA-370-01-07. An AML range is the minimum and a desired upper level for the population of horses within a HMA.

The estimated population for the High Rock HMA, including foals is 482 wild horses. However, an unknown number of these horses have moved to adjacent lands outside the HMA.

Description of the Proposed Action

The Surprise Field Office proposes to gather and remove an estimated 404 wild horses (including foals) from the High Rock HMA and adjacent areas. The goal would be to leave 78 wild horses

within the HMA consistent with low end of the AML range. Following the gather, wild horses would be allowed to increase to the upper end of the AML range when additional gathers would be scheduled (approximately 3-4 years). The gather would be completed using a helicopter to herd horses from the wilderness areas and other portions of the HMA into trapping facilities. The gather is scheduled for September, 2006. Gathering facilities would be located outside of wilderness area boundaries.

The proposed action also includes repair of the existing fence on the east side of the herd management area that acts as boundary between the High Rock HMA and the Warm Springs Canyon HMA. An preliminary environmental assessment analyzing potential effects of capturing and managing wild horses within the herd management areas will be issued and available for review in late June 2006.
