
The Elko County CRMP Committee is presently updating its organization membership list and its officail designated representative list.

Thank you for your inquiry regarding names of WHOA members within your community to participate in your 'local' CRMP.

Reluctantly, WHOA must decline your invitation for a local representative at this time. Our members are people who join WHOA out of mutual concern and philosophies. They join so that WHOA would represent their sentiments in protecting and managing wild horse and burro populations; not the other way around.

Surprisingly enough, WHOA's "non-local" representation in other areas has brought about some successful CRMP agreements; and we have not found it a hardship to participate in the overall CRMP, or the individual areas where wild horses exist.

Your "preference" then excludes WHOA from representing our membership, and as such is not a true CRMP.
