TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

LINE TWO IS NONUSE FOR CONSERVATION AND PROTECTION OF FEDERAL RANGE
AUTHORIZED GRAZING USE WILL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AREA MANAGERS
FINAL MULTIPLE USE DECISION DATED DECEMBER 22, 1994.

ANTELOPE VALLEY USE AREA

A THREE PASTURE DEFERRED-ROTATION GRAZING SYSTEM IS IN EFFECT FOR THE ANTELOPE VALLEY USE AREA FOR CATTLE. GRAZING WILL BE ROTATED BETWEEN THE NORTH AND SOUTH PASTURE OF THE CHIN CREEK ALLOTMENT IN THE ELY DISTRICT AND THE ANTELOPE VALLEY ALLOTMENT IN THE ELKO DISTRICT. IN ANY GIVEN YEAR TWO OF THE THREE PASTURES WILL RECEIVE TWO AND A HALF MONTHS OF WINTER USE AND ONE PASTURE WILL RECEIVE TWO MONTHS SPRING USE. THE SEASON OF USE IS 11/01 TO 05/31. USE IN THE ANTELOPE VALLEY NORTH AND SOUTH PASTURES COMBINED SHALL NOT EXCEED FIVE MONTHS OF GRAZING USE. THE PERMITTEE WILL HAUL WATER DURING THE DRY PERIODS WHEN USING THE ANTELOPE VALLEY ALLOTMENT TO BUREAU DESIGNATED SITES UNTIL PERMANENT WATER IS DEVELOPED. PERMITTEE AGREES TO MOVE OFF THE AREA PRIOR TO 05/31 SHOULD THE AUTHORIZED OFFICER DETERMINE, AFTER

CONSULTATION WITH THE PERMITTEE, THE MEADOW GRASSES ON THE PERMITTEE'S PRIVATE LANDS HAVE REACHED 6" IN HEIGHT.

DEVIATIONS IN THE GRAZING SYSTEM AND LIVESTOCK NUMBERS, ETC WILL BE ALLOWED BY THE BLM TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE RESOURCES AND THE PERMITTEE AS LONG AS THESE DEVIATIONS ARE CONSISTENT WITH ATTAINMENT OF THE MULTIPLE USE OBJECTIVES. DEVIATIONS WILL REQUIRE A WRITTEN APPLICATION AND WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION/LICENSE FROM THE WELLS RESOURCE AREA MANAGER PRIOR TO GRAZING USE. THE REQUEST MUST BE APPLIED IN WRITING, AT LEAST FIVE WORKING DAYS PRIOR TO THE PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION DATE. THE BLM WILL RESPOND TO SUCH AN APPLICATION WITHIN FIVE WORKING DAYS OF RECEIPT.

ALL RANGE IMPROVEMENTS WILL BE MAINTAINED/REPAIRED PRIOR TO LIVESTOCK TURNOUT.

AN ACTUAL GRAZING USE REPORT, MUST BE SUBMITTED TO OUR OFFICE WITHIN 15 DAYS FROM THE LAST DAY OF SCHEDULED USE.

SUPPLEMENTAL FEEDING IS LIMITED TO SALT, MINERAL AND/OR PROTEIN SUPPLEMENTS IN BLOCK, GRANULAR OR LIQUID FORM. SUCH SUPPLEMENTS MUST BE PLACED AT LEAST 1/4 MILE FROM LIVE WATERS (SPRINGS, STREAMS, AND TROUGHS), WET OR DRY MEADOWS, AND ASPEN STANDS.

ALL RIPARIAN EXCLOSURES, INCLUDING SPRING DEVELOPMENT EXCLOSURES, ARE CLOSED TO LIVESTOCK USE UNLESS SPECIFICALLY AUTHORIZED IN WRITING BY THE AREA MANAGER.

PAYMENT OF GRAZING FEES IS DUE ON OR BEFORE THE DUE DATE SPECIFIED ON THE GRAZING BILL. FAILURE TO PAY THE GRAZING BILL WITHIN 15 DAYS OF THE DUE DATE SPECIFIED ON THE BILL SHALL RESULT IN A LATE FEE ASSESSMENT OF \$25.00 OR 10 PERCENT OF THE GRAZING BILL, WHICHEVER IS GREATER, BUT NOT TO EXCEED \$250.00.

An evaluation of the multiple use objectives identified for the Antelope Valley Allotment was completed and an Area Manager's Final Multiple Use Decision was issued on December 22, 1994. No appeals were received. This multiple use decision identified the management actions necessary to meet these multiple use objectives.

The enclosed grazing permit is a statement of your recognized grazing preference on the public land administered by the BLM, and it includes the terms and conditions under which the authorized grazing use will be made. The term of the grazing permit will remain unchanged, that is from March 1, 1989 to February 28, 1999.
