#### AGENCY COMMENTS:

The Department is not opposed to wild horse management on the Nellis NTTR. And, we agree with the BLM that reduction in the appropriate management level (AML) is necessary to manage the wild horse population in a thriving natural ecolological balance with other multiple uses and natural resources, especially the prime directive of the Nellis NTTR, wildlife and their habitats. However, we remain fundamentally steadfast in our opposition to adoption of the Nellis NTTR RMP/FEIS and the supporting Record of Decision for the following reasons:

- Expansion of the Herd Management Area (HMA) is well beyond the combined boundaries of the Nevada Wild Horse Range and 1971 Horse Use Area delineated in the 1992 Nellis RMP ROD without offering compelling justification for the expansion;
- Despite the reduced AML target, a dangerous precedent has been adopted legitimizing expanded use of the NTTR by wild horses without forage . and water data based on appropriate monitoring methods. This encourages continued, unmeasurable competition between wild horse and wildlife for forage and water, and the resultant, broader ecological consequences remaining unknown;
- Development of water sources where water was not previously available (e.g. Cactus Spring to Cactus Flat) to benefit wild horses in their present . distribution encourages further expansion of horses beyond the "core area" defined by BLM.

These reasons underscore why the present Nellis NTTR RMP/FEIS and ROD are not consistent with the intent of the Wild and Free-Roaming Horse and Burro Act of 1971 of which the State of Nevada has parallel commitments as asserted in NRS 504.
