LAKE DIVERSION SURVEY TO BE MADE AT ONCE

Engineer to Organize Party for Study of Tunnel Project.

(Special to The Denver Post.)

Greeley, Colo., July 30.—Orders for immediate commencement of an engineering survey for the Grand Lake water diversion project, which will bring water from the Colorado river thru a ten-mile tunnel into the Big Thompson river on the eastern slope, where it will be used for irrigation purposes, were received here Tuesday by L. L. Stimson, Greeley civil engineer.

Stimson was ordered by the United States reclamation bureau to report at Grand Lake immediately to perfect the survey organization. Stimson will be in charge of the field crew of surveyors.

Stimson went to Denver to confer with reclamation bureau officials, who have set aside \$150,000 for the survey. Appropriations for the tunnel construction have not been made.

Two automobiles filled with engineers left for Grand Lake and other engineers were sent to the scene from Denver Tuesday. Because of the lateness of the season only field work in surface geology and surveys can be completed before winter. Locations will be made for test holes to be drilled over the route of the proposed tunnel.

Two tunnel routes will be surveyed, one to lead the east portal of the tunnel into one of the branches of the St. Vrain river and the second emptying into the Thompson river valley above Estes Park.
