Governor John Sparks,

Dear Governor:

I sent a consignment of mail to you addressed Georgetown Texas. I selected such as I thought would interest you at a distance.

Received your New York letter and was glad to know that conditions were favorable to you for another meat contract.

I am alone, Lieutenant Governor only stayed a few days. I received a letter asking me not to call him unless it was absolutely necessary.

Mr. Miller is getting along about as usual, the weather stormy and unpleasant preventing him from taking outside exercise, but for the last two days dressed and came down stairs. It rains nearly every night. I don't remember so long a season of wet weather.

Mrs. Sparks was ^{here} all of last week and went home Saturday evening. She is not in the best of health but managed to keep up during her stay.

I have had quite a seige endeavoring to treat

Gray the well borer for the purpose of notifying him to remove his machinery from the Capitol Grounds & finally caught him at Denver and he responded that he would be here as soon as possible.

It is quite likely that we will have another hanging match, the two Indians that murdered the old cripple in Elko County and then placed his body on a pile of burning R.R. ties were sentenced and brought to the Prison for execution, enclosed find Judge Browns statement at the time of sentence.

Every thing pertaining to the office is running smoothly, our girl has taken a vacation but I will do the best I can to carry the business through.
