## ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

This is to certify that we, the undersigned, namely: Philip Dater, James Dater, Wm. Sturgis, Jr., N. R. Davis; II. G. Hay, Thos. Sturgis, Wm. C. Lane, C. M. Oelrichs and E. B. Bronson have this twenty-second day of September, 1880, associated ourselves together, with others, under the name of The Chey enne Club.

The purpose of this Association snall be to establish and maintain a pleasure resort and place of amusement.

This Association shall pursue the purpose of its organization in the City of Cheyenne, Laramie County, Wyoming Territory.

The duration of this Association shall be perpetual, but may be terminated at the time and in the manner voted by a majority of its members.

This Association shall be under the direction and management of nine Trustees, to be known as the Board of Governors. The following named gentlemen constitute said Board, who shall manage the affairs of the Association for the first year, or intil the next annual election, in accordance with the laws of Wyoming Territory : Philip Dater, J. Howard Ford, Richard Frewen, Wm. C. Lane, Harry Oelrichs, Edgar B. Bronson, A. R. Converse, N. R. Davis, Wm. Sturgis, Jr.

BY-LAWS.

## BY-LAWS.

GOVERNMENT.
I. The government and management of the Cheyenne Club shall be confided to a board of nine Governors, to be elected by the members of the Club at the annual business meeting, and to serve until their successors shall have been elected and qualified. Vacancies in the Board of Governors, from any cause, shall be filled by the Board for the unexpired portion of the fiscal year.
II. The Board of Governors shall hold meetings monthly during each year, dating from the time of the annual business meeting of the Club, and at such other times as they may be called by the President. A quorum at such meetings shall consist of five members.
III. It shall be the duty of the Board of Governors after their election, to meet without unnessary delay and to elect from their number a President, a Vice-President and a Secretary, also a Treasurer, which last may not be a member of their board.
IV. The President, or in his absence, the Vice-President, shall perform the usual duties of the office. He shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Governors, and in case of the absence of both officers the meeting shall be called to order and a Chairman elected.
V. The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Club, and of the Board of Governors, and of the House Committee, shall notify members of meetings to which they are called, shall notify new members of their election, shall keep a roll of the members of the Club, conduct its correspondence, and shall keep proper books of accounts showing the entire business affairs of the Club.
VI. The Treasurer shall be the custodian of the funds of the Club. All receipts shall be paid to him by the Secretary, and he shall make all disbursements on warrants signed by the President or Vice-President and countersigned by the Secretary. He shall keep a record of all such receipts and disbursements and shall make a quarterly report to the Board of Governors of the affairs of his office.
VII. The interpretation of the By-Laws and House Rules shall at all times rest with the Board of Governors.
VIII. The Board of Governors shall appoint a House Committee of three, who may or may not be members of its own body, and shall from time to time prescribe the duties of such committee.
IX. At its annual business meeting the Club shall elect for the ensuing year, five of its members (none of whom shall be on the Board of Governors), to constitute a Committee on Admissions. Vacancies in said Committee may be filled by the Committee for the remainder of the current year. Three members shall constitute a quorum, and three affirmative votes
shall be necessary to cause a recommendation to the Board of Governors.
X. This committee shall elect its own chairman and secretary, which latter shall report privately in writing its proceedings to the Secretary of the Club; shall meet for the transaction of business when called by its chairman.

XI, The proceedings of the Committee on Admissions shall be secret and confidential, and no member of such Committee shall be questioned as to its actions.
membership.
I. The number of members of this Club shall not exceed two hundred, but the Club may at any annual meeting, by a majority vote of members present, enlarge its membership.
II. Every candidate for membership must be at least twenty one years of age, and must be proposed and seconded by two members of the Club. The name and residence of the candidate proposed, together with the signatures of the members proposing and seconding, must be posted on the bulletin board of the Club for at least fourteen days before being referred to the Board of Governors.
III. A rejected candidate cannot under one year be again proposed.
IV. Elections of new members shall be made by the Board of Governors, upon the recommendation of the Committee on Admissions. Ballots shall be secret, and one black ball shall reject.
V. Each member proposed after January ist 1888, shall pay an entrance fee of $\$ 50$, and an annual due of $\$ 50$, payable in advance; and a member admitted after the end of the first six months of any fiscal year, shall pay at the rate of $\$ 5$ per month for the unexpired portion of the year.
VI. Every member elected shall within thirty days after being informed thereof by the Secretary, pay to the Treasurer his entrance fee and first year's dues, and shall then, and not until then, become a member of the Club. A failure to do so for three months after notification shall be deemed a declination of membership.
VII. Any person neither residing nor doing business within fifty miles of the City of Cheyenne may be admitted as a visitor of the Club for a period of seven (7) days, which invitation may be repeated four times in any calendar year; and each member shall have the privilege of entertaining not to exceed two guests at any one time. All invitations shall be issucd by the llouse Committee, who shall have the right to decline to issue or to recall any such invitation. Officers of the army and navy shall not be considered as residents under this clause, but shall be eligible as guests, and may be elected in the manner prescribed for regular members, but shall be exempt from payment of initiation fees and shall not be allowed to vote, and shall pay the same dues as non resident members.
VIII. Any person eligible under the above clause as a guest of this Club may be invited for one month, by the House
committee, to all the privileges of the Club House, upon payment of ten (Io) dollars, and such invitation may be renewed at the pleasure of the House Committee ; of such guest may be invited by the House Committee for a period or six months upon payment of the annual dues.
IX. All complaints shall be made in writing to the Board of Governors, who shall have discretionary powers in all cases as to penalties to be infficted, and from whose decisions there shall be no appeal.
X. All resignations shall be in writing and addressed to the Secretary, but no resignation can be considered while the member wishing to resign shall be indebted to the Club.
XI. All right and interest of any member in the property and privileges of the Club shall cease with the termination of his membership.
XII. The Board of Governors is empowered at any meeting to expel or recommend the resignation of any member who shall have violated the rules of the Club, such action to be taken only on a two thirds vote of the Board of Governors.
XIII. Any member shall forfeit his membership in the Club whose conduct shall be pronounced by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Governors to have endangered the welfare, interests, or character of the Club.
XIV. The following additional offences may also cause the expulsion of any member, upon written complaint and proof thereof to the Board of Governors :
I. Drunkenness in the precincts of the Club to a degree which shall be offensive to members or injurious to the standing of the Club.
2. Profanity or obscenity.
3. A blow struck in quarrel within the precincts of the Club.
4. Cheating at cards or any game played in the Club House.
5. Refusal to conform to the By-Laws or House Rules of the Club.
6. The commission of a criminal act, or an act so dishonorable in social life as to unfit the guilty person for the society of gentlemen.
XV. The name of any member failing to pay his annual dues, or any special assessment, within thirty days of the time when such are payable, shall be posted by the Treasurer in a conspicuous place in the Club House, and shall he neglect payment without good cause for ninety days, he shall thereupon cease to be a member; provided, that upon his written application and the payment of all dues to the date thereof, the Board of Governors may at the discretion remit the penalty of this By Law.
XVI. The accounts of members will be placed once a fortnight in the Club letter box of each, and payment must be made within two weeks, or indebtedness may be paid in cash at the time incurred, at the pleasure of the member.
XVII. Any member who has paid an entrance fee and annual dues for one year, and who shall be absent from Cheyenne continuously for a period of one fiscal year or longer, may, on making application to the Board of Governors before leaving, and stating time of absence, be relieved from payment of dues during such absence
XVIII. Non-residents of the City of Cheyenne otherwise eligible, may be elected as members and classified separately as non-resident members. They shall not be entitied to hold office or vote while belonging to such non-resident class. Nonresident members shall pay one-hall the entrance fee and onehalf the annual dues. When a non-resident member shall have resided in the city for three consecutive months, or for the greater portion of the time during six month, , he shall be considered a resident member and will be required to pay the balance of his entrance fees and the regular dues. Resident members may become non resident members by giving notice to the Secretary of their intention of becoming non-residents of the City.

## ASSESSMEXTS.

I. In the event of the Board of Governors deeming a special assessment necessary, notification of such proposed assessment shall be given by the Secretary to all members of the Club, thirty days before the meeting at which it is to be considered, and it shall be the duty of members unable to be present at such meeting to secure representation by proxy.
II. Such assessment shall be made only by a two-thirds vote of all members of the Club, and payment of the same shall be obligatory, under the regulation prescribed for payment of annual dues.

## MEETINGS

I. The annual meeting of this Club shall be held at eight p. m. on the first Thursday in April of each year, at which date the fiscal year shall be deemed to commence.
II. At any Club meeting eleven members shall constitute a quorum.
III. At the meeting of this Club the order of business, so far as possible, shall be as follows :
I. Reading the minutes of the last meeting.
2. Elections.
3. Reports of Secretary, Treasurer, etc.
4. Reports of Special Committees.
5. General business.
IV. Special meetings may be called at any time by the President, with the approval of three other members of the Board of Governors, and shall be called whenever the President shall be requested to do so, in writing, by ter members of the Club, setting forth the object of such meeting. At any such meeting no business, other than that specified in the call, shall be considered except by unanimous consent.
V. No person who is not a member of the Club shall be
present at any business meeting thereof unless he be specially invited by the President.
VI. The Secretary shall furnish to the Inspectors of Elections an alphabetical list of all the members entitled to vote at such election.
VII. Written proxies may be used at any meeting of this Club, either annual or special, but not in meetings of the Board or of Committees.

## AMENDMENTS.

I. The By-Laws of this Club may be amended at any meeting of the Club, the proposer having posted upon the notice board the words of the proposed alteration or addition for at least thirty days immediately preceding such meeting, when, if two-thirds of those present shall vote in its favor, the amendment shall be adopted.
II. The House Rules of this Club may at any time be amended by the Boaru of Governors.

## HOUSE RULES.

HOURS.
The Club House will be open every day at 7 . a. m.
The wine room will be closed at midnight, and no member except lodgers will be admitted to the Club House after that hour.

STRANGERS.
Residents of Cheyenne, or others not eligible as visitors under the rules, may be admitted to all public rooms of the Club (accompanied by a member) for not exceeding one occasion in each month, upon registry of name, address and date of visit, together with the name of member introducing in the Club register. No person not a member of the Club, or a visitor in accordance with the rules, shall be admitted in any other way than herein prescribed to any part of the Club House, other han the reading room and cafe' while calling on a member.

This rule shall not be construed to prevent lodgers taking persons to their rooms when so disposed.

## VISITORS.

Members introducing visitors into the Club House will be considered responsible for their concluct while there, and for any indebtedness to the Club which they may contract. Every guest must be registered in the visitor's book by the member introducing. If for more than one day, a written application
for an invitation must be made to the House Committee. No guest shall entertain in the Club House encept Club members, or other guests of the Club.

Visitors entered for one day will not be permitted to give any orders in the Club House.

The charge for a thirty day card shall be ten dollars.

## LODGINGS.

Applications for lodgings, either furnished or unfurnished, will be considered in the order in which they are received at the Club House. Terms for the same can be obtained from the Steward.

READING ROOM.
No wines, liquors or mineral waters will be served in the reading room.

DINING ROOM.
All meals served a la carte.
Breakfast, 7:30 a. m. to 9:30 a. m.
Lunch, 12:30 p. m. to $2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.
Dinner, 6 p. m. to 7:30 p. m.

## PRIVATE ROOMS.

Private dining rooms cannot be assigned to parties numbering less than four persons.

The Steward will not be required to serve meals in private rooms on less than twenty-four hours' notice.

An extra charge will be made for the use of the rooms, to be fixed by the House Committee.

BILLIARD ROOM.
The pool tables must not be occupied by one party for more than three games when others are waiting. The billiard table must not be occupied by one party for more than one-half hour when others are waiting,

Pool, 5 cents per cue per game.
Billiards, 60 cents per hour.

## GAMES.

All games may be played in the rooms, of the Club House appropriate to the purpose, but no game shall be played for a money stake.

No round game leading to conversation will be played in the whist room on the second floor after $7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.

## CARDS.

Fresh cards sent to card room, 50 cents per pack. No charge for cards used in cafe.
BETTING.

The making of wagers of any description, for money, in the public rooms of the Club House is strictly prohibited.

## SUNDAY.

All games are prohibited on Sunday.

## ORDERS.

On giving any order, a ticket showing the amount must be presented to the member for signature. If paid in cash the member will detach the coupon marked "Unpaid."

If coupon be not detached the amount will be charged to the member signing.

MEMBERS' ACCOUNTS.
Accounts of members are payable on the Ist and I5th of each month.

Any member becoming indebted to the Club at any time in the sum of one hundred dollars or more, shall be immediately notified of the same, and upon failure to pay the indebtedness after notification, his name shall be pested, and his credit suspended until the indebtedness already incurred shall have been discharged.

If an account stard overdue two weeks, the member will be notified by the placing of his name and the amount due on the Club bulletin.

If an account stand overdue thirty days, the delinquent member shall be suspended from the privileges of the Club Ilouse at the discretion of the House Committee.

Attention of members is especially called to the necessity of settling their Club bills before leaving town. Such accounts cannot be carried in the books, and the rule against delinquents will be enforced.

## COMPLALNTS

Members are invited to make written complaints to the House Committee of anything in the administration of the Club House seeming to need correction, but are not allowed to make complaints to the Steward or attendants. Complaints should be made in writing.

BREAKAGE.
Glass, crockery, or other property of the Club, if broken or injured, must be promptly paid for by the member with whom the injury may occur.

## SMOKING.

Smoking will not be permitted in the dining room between $7 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and 7:30 p. m.

Smoking of pipes will not be permitted in any of the public rooms of the Club House.

MFSSENGERS.
Servants are not permitted to leave the house on errands for member, except on Club business.
SUBSCRIPTIONS.

No subscription paper can be circulated nor any article exposed for sale in the Club House without permission of House Committee.

## CLUB PROPERTY

No member shall take from the Club House any property whatever belonging to the Club, without an order from the House Committee; or any book, pamphlet or newspaper from any public room, or mutilate or deface the same.

## GRATUITIES.

The giving of any gratuity to any servant or employee of the Club is strictly prohibited.

## STEWARD.

The Steward is required to observe any violation of these rules and to report the same to the House Committee.
