



When they saw their views would not be tolerated in Ongland, they deemed it wise to leave the country Some of their number were called Pilgrims, others Ouritans. At was the pilgrims who instituted Thanksgiving day. When they gathered in the harvest in the autumn following their arrival, they had some things to be thankful for. One of the Filtrinia in writing of the first Franksgring Day in america said, - Our harvest being gotten is, our governor sent four men out a fowling that we might, after a special manne, rejoice together after we had the fruit of our labor. They four in one day killed as much four as with a little help beside, served the company almost a week. Ut that time among to other recreations we exercised our arms, Many of the Indians coming among us and among the rest their greatest King, Massasoit, with some nines men, whom for three days were entertained and feasted, and they went out and killed five deer, which they brought to the Lenton Sparke
