Dear Dr. Church:

I am hoping that this letter didn't get into your hands but that you have already been discharged from the hospital. However if you are still there I want you to know that I am here and working hard. In fact I would have written sooner but I didn't have the time. I am also hoping that they don't let you out before you are fully recovered. In fact I believe it better, for your health, that you don't attend the meeting since you know you won't rest if you do.

I contacted Mr. Seligman late Saturday and received the letter you wrote from him. I find him to be a very able gentleman and quite willing to help out. In fact, because Smetana speaks no English, Seligman is acting as chairman.

Both Smetana and Dewant speak

no English and I fear that I am

do not ask questions at all. I

received.

I presented your subject

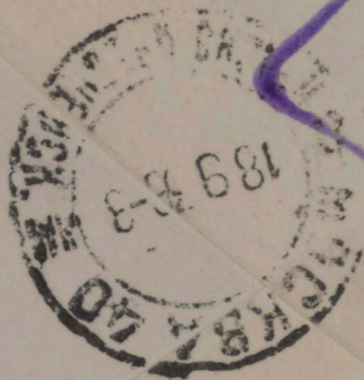

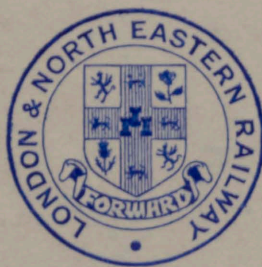

Dear Sir,

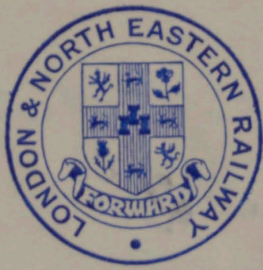
I was very sad to hear this morning, at my arrival here in Edinburgh, that you were ill in Moscow. Afterwards G. Seligman delivered me your letters from the 9th and 10th inst. I thank you very much for them and your kind words.

This morning, before the opening of the sessions of the Association, took place a meeting of the Executive Committee (Dr. Smetana being Chairman, and Dr. Benoit-Secretary). It was decided to call forth on our commission as Commission of snow and ice.

Prof. Sobrowoiesnia suggested ur-
gently to form a new asso-
ciation of snow and ice inde-
pendant from the Association
of Hydrology, but this was not
accepted. You were chosen the
President of the Commission
for the next 3 years, Prof. So-
browoiesni, Dr. Lutschy, Dr. Sver-
ovup and Prof. Fairstem (Mos-
cow) - 4 Vicepresidents. Dr. Mer-
nauton was not present and
I was charged to act as Secre-
tary.

Before the going over to
the reports of the Commission
of snow Dr. Smetane made
a speech in which he pointed
out the big ^(and scientific) ~~(organizational)~~ work
you have done in the passed
3 years and regretted very
much that you could not be
present on account of illness.
He proposed to send you telegram.
