HEALTH HINTS

Good health is priceless. Guard yours by intelligent care. The fundamental health hints noted below are from eminent authority, and tend not only to length of days, but to fullness thereof.

Physical Fitness. Have a thorough physical examination annually. A good plan is to do this on your birthday, as a means of insuring regularity. Remember this ounce of prevention outweighs pounds of cure.

Diet. Let your diet be as varied as your means permit. Be sure it includes some form of fruit, fish, milk, cheese, eggs and vegetables.

Water. Drink pure water freely, six or eight glasses a day.

Teeth. Clean them thoroughly morning and night. Have a dentist carefully examine them at regular six months' intervals.

Cleanliness. Practice the daily bath; for cleanliness is an important health measure. To guard against infection keep the nails clean, and wash your hands before eating.

Breathing. Get your share of oxygen by breathing fresh air, inhaled through the nose. Indulge in deep breathing exercises daily.

Exercise. Exercise in the fresh air and sunlight. If you can't play games, walking is just as good.

Rest. Relax your nerves by taking plenty of rest and sleep, with windows open.

Protect Cuts. Every cut or break in the skin should be thoroughly cleansed at once, using a mild antiseptic and covering with a sterile dressing.

Sickness. In the event of unusual symptoms with which you are not familiar, consult a doctor immediately. Don't guess, and avoid promiscuous advice.

Clothing. Dress consistently with the weather, wearing warm outer clothing rather than warm underclothing. Keep the feet dry.

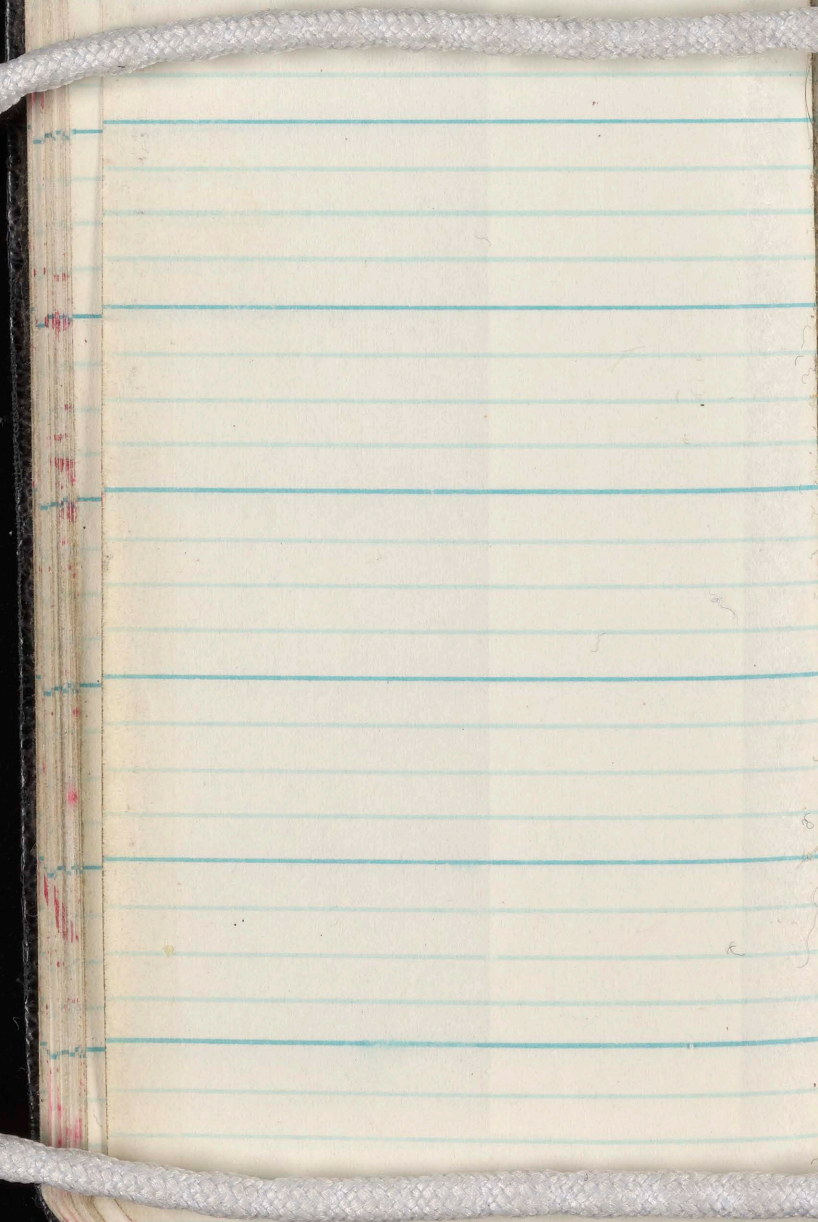
