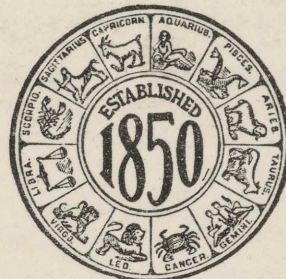

RATES OF POSTAGE

Official at time of printing. As changes are likely, consult Post Office.

UNITED STATES AND POSSESSIONS

First Class—Letters, written and sealed matter for local delivery or otherwise per oz. 3c.

Air Mail—Anywhere U. S. Domestic Mail Service is in operation per oz. 6c—Limit 8 ozs., Air Mail Post Cards 4c.

Second Class—2c first 2 ounces, 1c for each additional 2 ounces, or the parcel post rates when such postage is lower. For Publishers' Rate consult nearest post office.

Third Class—2c first 2 ozs., 1c each additional oz. Books (including catalogs) of 24 pages or more, seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots and plants. 2c for first 2 ounces, 1½c each additional 2 ounces.

Fourth Class (Parcel Post)—Merchandise, printed matter, and all other mailable matter not in first, second or third class. Zone rates of postage apply. Consult nearest Post Office for rates.

Special Handling—Fourth class matter only. Parcels of fourth class matter indorsed "Special Handling" will be given the most expeditious handling, transportation and delivery practicable (but not special delivery) upon payment, in addition to the regular postage, of the following charge; up to 2 lbs., 15c; over 2 lbs. up to 10 lbs., 20c; over 10 lbs., 25c.

Registered Mail (postage extra)—40c to \$1.75 including indemnity of \$5 to \$1,000. Declaration of value must be made to P. O.—not on article. 7c fee charged for return receipt for domestic

registered mail when requested at time of mailing.

Special Delivery (postage extra)—First class to 2 lbs., 20c; over 2 lbs. to 10 lbs., 35c; over 10 lbs., 50c.

Other classes—to 2 lbs., 35c; over 2 lbs. to 10 lbs., 45c; over 10 lbs., 60c.

Money Orders—(limit for each \$100) For domestic money orders the fees are as follows:

Thus, an American may prepay the reply postage of his foreign correspondent.
