Dear Dr. Church,-

I received the first article for Engineering News-Record, and now have it typed and ready to send to you. I will check it this evening and it will go forward tomorrow.

I have the sheet on the Truckee at Iceland nearly completed, but will send to Mr. Wentworth for the late figures and incorporate them in the sheet.

As for that article in the Saturday Evening Post. I will look around the house, as I know I have one I can send you. It was a long article - a grim and deadly thrust at Nevada.

The only important rivers of which we have no sheets are the Pit, McCloud, Owens, Merced, Klamath (Keno), and one or two others such as Bishop Creek and Pine Creek (Round Valley).

I have not received my check for July, and am wondering whether you will have occasion to write to the Department soon, and whether you could mention it. I hesitate to be forever calling their attention to it -- they have treated me so nicely.

Mr. Payne says Lahontan was first used for irrigation in 1917, but I will look it up definitely. Have been unable to learn anything about when Floriston commenced operations, but will make another search.
